Dear Brother Sojourners,

How many of you are familiar with the Freedom Foundation at Valley Forge and our Youth Leadership Conference that goes on there each year? I attended the conference in July 2012 and the youth that attended are the future of this country. They all participated in the various activities presented to them and were very much in tune with what goes on in our world. There were, however, some who did not know that they were being sponsored by Masons. Therefore, I would ask that chapters who are sending the students to Valley Forge make sure that they know that the National Sojourners are first and foremost Masons. Advise them of what Masons stand for and that the program is about Americanism and Patriotism. Also, tell them that if they are in an ROTC unit to bring along their uniform. They established a flag detail which held two ceremonies. One ceremony retired the flag in the evening and another raised the flag in the morning. Those that brought their uniforms wore them proudly and were quite distinguished in them. It made for a great flag detail. They participated in discussions of the *Declaration of Independence* and in a ceremony they all signed a copy. Afterward, the staff gave each of them a copy of what they had signed. Americanism and Patriotism are the corner stones of our organization and these Youth Leadership Conferences, be they Freedom Foundation or the Military Order of the World Wars, Youth Leadership Conferences, are the pathway for our youth to be better informed of our country and what it stands for. I would like to encourage each Chapter to try and send, at least one, student to Valley Forge. We need more participation as there were only 54 students that attended this year. Learn the *Toast to the Flag* and offer to present it at functions that you attend. You would be surprised at the response that you will get when finished with your presentation. Consequently, we'll report at this time on just two "of interest News" items. July 4th has been a special day each year for Bro. Edwin S. Moore, III. Since 1973, Bro. Ed has participated in an annual special bell ringing ceremony

in the bell tower atop Independence Hall in Philadelphia. This activity is manned by members of the 'Independence Hall Bell Ringers Society' which was formed by a small group of veterans just after WWII. The actual number of "bell ringers" each year of course is limited because of the very small space in the tower. This year, though, was a special feeling for Bro. Ed, along with his son Jay, and grandson William, age 14 - three generations of family. Together they climbed the narrow/steep stairway up the Tower and performed the necessary honors. The Centennial Bell (placed in 1876) in the Independence Hall Tower was rung in coordination with the tapping of the actual Liberty Bell, now located in a secured visitor center in nearby Independence Square. Bro. Ed reports that his two most memorable ceremonies were: in 1976 - when his team rang the Bell 200 times, in celebration of the 200th year of the signing of the Declaration of Independence; and again in 1990 - during the 200th year celebration of the Funeral of Benjamin Franklin. Over the past year, member Walt West, (WWII, USAAF), went with Valor Tours, Ltd. to attend three non-celebratory but moving and sincere occasions related to WWII. First, on Guadalcanal for the Annual U.S. Memorial ceremony on August 7th. About twenty countries also solemnly and gratefully placed their wreaths. Bro. Walt had donated a Tree and Plaque in his brother's name in the beautiful Memorial Grove located just outside the entrance to famed Henderson Field. His late brother, a Mason, was with the First Marine Division on the island. Walt was so impressed with the beauty and meaning of this Memorial Grove for all who had served in the Pacific Theater, that this year he also donated another Tree and Plaque - this one from **National Sojourners Benjamin Franklin Chapter #16**. This past March, he then attended the annual joint U.S.-Japanese "Return with Honor" Memorial Ceremony on Iwo Jima. Finally, in June, following a week touring USAAF and RAF historical and active sites in England, he was privileged to attend the dedication of the new RAF Bomber Command WWII Memorial near Buckingham Palace. NATIONAL COMMANDERS MESSAGE



Greetings Fellow Heroes of '76 and Sojourners, If you look in a Merriam-Webster dictionary for the word "Landmark", you will find this word defined in several different ways. It is used as a "marker" of a boundary of land; a conspicuous object marking a locality; a structure used as a reference point to other structures; a structure with Historic or Aesthetic importance; a structure set aside for preservation. There is one other definition; an event or development that marks a turning point or a stage.

It is this last definition that applies to the Directives listed in our Heroes Manual. Much like the Law Books issued by every Grand Lodge, Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery throughout this great land of ours. It is by the issuance of these Laws or Landmarks that the governing bodies intend to keep that particular

Body operating on a level (straight and narrow if you will) road or playing field ensuring continuity throughout the jurisdiction. Since I live in Texas, I am bound by my honor to adhere to the Laws of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Texas. I can tell you from experience that the Grand Master himself will not set aside Grand Lodge Law here in Texas for the appeasement of anyone. It is for this reason that I love and respect a good many of our Past Grand Masters.

The vast majority of us would not entertain the notion of breaking or going against the Laws of the Grand Bodies under whose jurisdiction we reside. The primary reason for our strict adherence to the Laws of the Grand Bodies is the Obligation we took while kneeling at an Altar, our hands on the greatest and most notable History Book ever published and uttered words like "so help me God". During the Heroes Degree, the Recruit is administered an Agreement with Stipulations. This Agreement is not referred to as an Obligation but should be taken as such with the same solemn honor as if you were kneeling at an Altar with your hands upon the HBS&C.

At the National Conventions and Mid-Winter Meetings the Heroes Manual Committee meets and lots of things are discussed, not just about the Heroes Manual. Some things that have been brought up during these meetings in years past are that some Heroes Camps do not follow the Landmarks (Laws) as explained in Chapter V, "Directives and Awards" section of the Heroes Manual.

Most newly made Heroes go straight to the Ritual and a lot of us forget that there is a section of the Manual prior to the Ritual. This is Part One, Organization, and explains who and what we are and under what Authority we exist. Part One is basically "everything you wanted to know about Heroes of '76 but didn't know to ask about".

So Brethren, at your Bivouacs, when you issue the new Hero his copy of the "Official Manual of the Heroes of '76®" (as you should be doing), explain that if they take the time to read Part One, they will have a better understanding of The Ritual Script located in Part Two of the Manual. Reading and understanding the importance of the Landmarks and Directives of our Order located in Part One could prevent any deviation of those Landmarks in the future and give us a smooth road to travel till we at last reach that last Camp Ground above. Also Brethren, remind your new Hero that our alliance is with the local Chapter of National Sojourners, Inc. and that the Camp exists to support the Chapter.

FORT TRUMBULL CAMP (New London #58).



Camp had the honor and privilege of carrying the replica of the Stonington Battle flag in the Stonington village Parade. Each year the Stonington Historical Society organizes

a participatory parade where the town's people come out aided by the Society's members and the towns fire trucks, ambulances and others to have a parade. The replica flag, 18 X 11 feet in size, is copied after the Battle Flag from the War of 1812.



The first celebration took place on August 10, 1815, a year after the battle, the first year of peace. Stonington's battle flag, the huge, shot-torn banner of sixteen stars and sixteen stripes, was raised at the 1814 fort, shown on old maps as a curved rampart facing to the south and west. A procession marched to the Congregational church, listened to an address by the Rev. Ira Hart, and returned to the fort, where a prayer closed the day. The historic Stonington flag, a very rare 16 star, 16-stripe example and possibly the only period 16 star flag in existence, had been on display for many years in the Ocean Bank building in Stonington, Connecticut. Recently it was taken down for cleaning and assessment and a replica made, as the original is very fragile. On the occasion of the 200th anniversary of the War of 1812, a special display was established at the Lyman Allyn Museum featuring the Stonington Battle Flag.
